Course aims

Course details

The course total time is 30 hours:

- 5 x one-hour fortnightly webinars at 15:00 GMT with a PSA teacher trainer
- 3 hours' online work per week, over 8 weeks, using the Moodle platform, plus final course assignment (one hour)

- Models to help teachers understand the pedagogy of using Educational Technology
- How digital technologies have changed ELT (focus on grammar, vocabulary, four skills and pronunciation)
- Gamification
- Blogs, wikis and Virtual Learning Environments
- Online tools, including forums and chat

- How to create digital materials
- Constraints and future developments, including augmented reality and adaptive learning
